## MODELS OF CRUSADERS AND SARACENS IN 20mm SCALE



A CRUSADER.

Those collectors who enjoy Ancient and Medieval Times will like these Greenwood-Scrubby 20mm castings of the Crusades.

The Crusaders are clad in chain mail, with the long tunic, while Casting GSC-260 is a fully armored knight riding a charging horse that is armored. These figures can be used for many medieval types from Normans of 1066 up until the decline of body armor and chain mail.

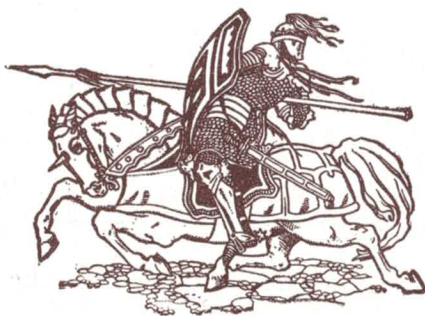
You'll like the Saracens for they are dressed in the middle eastern style and can be used for a tremendous variety of desert warriors of both Ancient and Mediaeval times. The Mounted Archer (GSC-263) is especially adaptable for many periods.

### INFANTRY

- GS-250 Crusader, firing a cross bow
- GS-251 Crusader, swinging long sword, with shield
- GS-252 Crusader, swinging battle axe, with shield
- GS-253 Crusader, on guard, holding long pike
  
- GS-254 Saracen archer, firing bow
- GS-255 Saracen, swinging scimitar, holding shield
- GS-256 Saracen, charging, with short spear

### CAVALRY

- GSC-260 Fully armored knight, charging with lowered lance, on armored horse
- GSC-261 Crusader, in chain mail, lowered lance, on charging horse
  
- GS-262 Saracen Mounted archer, firing bow
- GS-263 Saracen Light Cavalryman, swinging scimitar, on charging horse



COLORING INFORMATION: Crusaders wore white tunics over their chain mail, and had white shields with large red cross painted on them. A red cross was worn on front and back of the tunic generally. The Saracens had no "uniform", wearing clothes of many colors like most Arabic people.
